Like her previous book, *The Dress Detective: A Practical Guide to Object-based Research*, also published by Bloomsbury in 2015, *Reading Fashion in Art* reveals the steps by which curators and historians undertake their analytical work. With a systematic approach that incorporates easy to follow checklists, the reader will learn how to appreciate the role and impact of clothing in a work of art.

Richly illustrated with colour images, the book is an art object unto itself and includes iconic and lesser known works of art spanning from the mid-eighteenth century to the present day by artists that identify as male, female, nonbinary, queer, Indigenous, people of colour, and disabled. Given that art history is not neutral, selecting artists to reflect diversity of representation was an important goal.

This scholarly book is accessible to all, offering art and dress history students as well as anyone interested in fashion, a means by which to unravel and interpret what they see in paintings, photographs, drawings and art installations that include the dressed body.
