Tina Bates was curator of history at the Canadian Museum of History for 22 years. She has published widely in the field of dress, including *A Cultural History of the Nurses Uniform*, which received the 2013 Millia Davenport Publication Award. She has been Editor-In-Chief of DRESS since 2014.

Cynthia Cooper is head of Collections and Research, as well as Curator of Dress, Fashion and Textiles, at the McCord Museum in Montreal. There she oversees the largest museum collection of Canadian dress, consisting of over 20,000 items.
