I hope you are all doing well and taking good care of yourself.

I am very happy to announce that the 2020 WOMEN IN MOTION AWARD FOR PHOTOGRAPHY has been given to SABINE WEISS. Born in 1924 in Switzerland, Sabine Weiss took to photography at an early age. After a three-year apprenticeship with Paul Boissonnas in Geneva, she became the assistant to Willy Maywald, a German photographer specializing in fashion and portraits in 1946. After marrying American painter Hugh Weiss in 1950, she launched her career as an independent photographer, and frequented the post-war arts world. She also worked on a long-term basis for the likes of Vogue, the New York Times Magazine, Life, Newsweek, Point de Vue-Images du Monde, Paris Match, Esquire and Holiday. Along with her assignments for French and international magazines, Sabine Weiss also worked until the 2000s for numerous institutions and brands, providing a variety of reportage, fashion shoots, advertising pictures, celebrity portraits and photographs of social issues.

Still active today, Sabine Weiss is a prolific artist; at the age of 96, she has probably enjoyed the longest career of any photographer, having devoted nearly 80 years to her art.
