<u>CFP ICOM COSTUME GENERAL CONFERENCE PRAGUE 2022 (separate meetings and joint meeting)</u> THEME: THE RITUAL POWER OF CLOTHING

The theme of the 2022 ICOM Costume Committee Annual Meeting is The Ritual Power of Clothing.

Rituals are inevitable part of religious, professional and personal life. They grow around the most important social events. We all have to submit to them, more or less willingly. All ritualistic behaviour requires a visual setting. It most important part is clothing. The right choice of garment proves commitment to the ritual and knowledge of the rules that govern it. The ritual power of fashion is the infinite and ever-changing field of researches.

Papers on following topics will be particularly welcomed, but do not hesitate to look for another aspect of luxury in fashion:

- Ritual clothes of people in power
- Liturgical garments and their meaning for religious rites
- Rites of passage and their system of fashion
- Decorum of fashion in professional life
- Magic in fashion lucky and unlucky clothes
- Performers and the public fashion on the stage or stadium and in the auditorium
- Home rituals clothes of cosiness, comfort and safety

Both abstract and the presentations will be in English. As there will be no translation, please make sure that your presentation will be easy to follow for an international audience.
