It is about time to give you some information about ICOM Costume activities during ICOM General Conference in Prague this summer (21-28 August 2022). The annual theme for our paper sessions is 'The Ritual Power of Clothing' and includes a joint meeting with GLASS and ICDAD on the theme 'The Power of Collecting'. On Thursday 25th August, off site meeting will be held at the Museum of Decorative Arts: visit of the museum storages, paper session and viewing of the 'Lace Sculpture' exhibition curated by our host and colleague in Prague Konstantina Hlaváčková. This exhibition will present large-scale lace works dating from the 1950s to the 1980s, examples of contemporary garment making in lace, and current works by artists whose work draws on some of the values of lace, such as transparency and the infinite freedom of movement of the thread.

Thursday 25th the French Embassy in Prague will host ICOM Costume to celebrate its 60th Anniversary at the French Cultural Institute.

On Friday 26th August the excursion day will bring ICOM Costume committee to Brno. Please tick the box for the excursion to Brno by Historical Train on the General Conference website. Konstantina has arranged a special tour for ICOM Costume in the city. (The excursion day is part of the General Conference Fee).

The post conference tour '<u>Clothing and Textiles in the Holdings of the Český Krumlov State Castle and Chateaux Kratochvíle</u>' is a 2-days trip (Saturday-Sunday 27th-28th August): The State Castle and Chateau in Český Krumlov (UNESCO, under the administration of the National Heritage Institute) houses the largest collection of historical clothing linked with the owners of a particular historical aristocratic residence in the

Czech Republic. This collection contains some 550 garments and clothing accessories dating from the late 16th century to the early 20th century. Chateaux Kratochvíle is a picturesque Renaissance summer palace with a collection of liturgical textiles and historical fabrics. (The post conference tour is not included in the General Conference Admission Fee)
